STUDY INFORMATION:

Researchers at Yale University and VA New York Harbor Healthcare System are recruiting subjects to participate in a study of upper limb prosthesis use in everyday tasks, both in the home and in a laboratory environment. Participation in this study will involve wearing a camera attached to a head mount to record your daily activities:

- In your home (7-8 hours)
- In the Yale lab (6-7 hours)

In the lab you will also have your movements recorded by a motion capture system as you complete common tasks.

QUALIFICATIONS TO PARTICIPATE:

- At least 18 years old
- Able to understand study requirements and sign an Informed Consent
- Live within a drivable distance to Yale University
- Be a current user of body powered or a myoelectric prosthesis and have used the device daily for at least 6 months prior to participating in this study
- Have no active problems with socket fit


